












About SPRING

SPRING is here to help parents and families through the worst possible time in their lives. We support parents and families through the loss of a baby – at any stage of pregnancy, at or just after birth – whatever the circumstances and however long ago.

Established in 1998, the SPRING service is part of the maternity services at University Hospitals Dorset, which brings parents and medical professionals together to ensure bereaved parents and families are treated with sensitivity and genuine care. Our support is available to bereaved parents and families living in Poole, Bournemouth and surrounding areas.

We know we can't make everything better when a baby dies, but we aim to make sure things aren't worse for bereaved parents.

How we can help

The loss of a baby can feel overwhelming. We offer a range of services and support to help bereaved parents and families along this devastating journey. Not everyone will need or want to make use of everything we offer. But it is here if you need it, now or in the future.

Emotional and practical support, at the point of loss and beyond

Bereavement support

We work closely with the Maternity Bereavement Support Service and Early Pregnancy Units at Poole and Royal Bournemouth Hospitals.

Specialist bereavement support midwives and nurses offer information, advice and signposting to help parents and families make informed choices, and will continue to offer support at home, if required.

Professional counselling

Counselling is available for all bereaved parents and relatives following the loss of a baby. SPRING and Poole Hospital counselling services provide sessions with fully qualified counsellors who adhere to British Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy guidelines (BACP).

Counselling provides a safe, non-judgemental environment. Referrals are via medical professionals or self-referral.

Monthly open support meetings

SPRING runs monthly open support meetings for informal peer support.

They are facilitated by fully qualified counsellors.

The meetings are friendly and relaxed and open to anyone who has experienced the death of a baby, either in pregnancy, at, or shortly after birth.

Baby Katie

Our journey began in 2012 when we decided to try for a baby. This happened fairly quickly, and

our baby was due May 2013.

My pregnancy wasn't great. I never felt my baby move and spent many hours at the maternity hospital having my baby monitored. Every time was the same outcome - baby was happy with a good heartbeat. Then, 3 months before she was due I was signed off with intervene growth restriction as my placenta wasn't working properly. Extra scans still showed a happy baby just on the small side.

At 37 weeks pregnant, I had a scan which showed our baby was breach and I was booked in for a caesarean section. On the 08 May 2013, Katie was born very poorly and was taken straight to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit but sadly, she didn't make it.

Kate was born with mitochondrial cardiomyopathy and her heart had failed.

Our world fell apart, feeling numb, and in shock, I didn't understand why this had happened to us. We later found out that we both carried the gene for mitochondrial cardiomyopathy and there was a 1 in 4 chance that this would happen every time we conceived.

I didn't know what to do...could I face having a baby? In the end we decided to try, and I fell pregnant. We were offered a chorionic villus sampling (CVS) test at 11 weeks which could tell us if this baby was affected like Katie. Unfortunately, this baby was and at 16 weeks I had to terminate.

We were then offered a treatment called preimplantation genetic diagnosis (PGD) at one of the London hospitals. This procedure helps identify embryos affected by a genetic defect and only health embryos will be

implanted. Again, the bad news came, I only produced three healthy eggs and sadly, they didn't develop enough to be used.

So that was it. It wasn't meant to be, and I began to think I would never be a mum.

In September 2017 I went for a routine doctors' appointment. My GP asked how everything was going. I told him the outcome and how the consultant in London had advised us to use an egg donor, and as far as I could see this wasn't something the NHS funded. As such, for us, it was the end of our journey. The GP did not see it that way and told me he would look into it to see if he could put a case together that he could then put forward to the funding board to see under these circumstances if they would grant funding. I had already accepted that I would never have a child so didn't get my hopes up.

To my surprise I received a letter at the end of October 2017 informing us that we had been granted funding and just had to wait for the fertility clinic at Salisbury to contact us.

Treatment started in December 2017 when the minefield of drugs and appointments began.

Our first two rounds failed due to there not being enough eggs to share from the donor. The requirement is right or more. But on the 14 February 2018, we got the phone call telling us we had nine eggs that were being fertilised. On the 19 February we went to Salisbury to have our embryo implanted. Now for the long two weeks wait to see if we were pregnant.

On 02 March 2018 we had a positive pregnancy test! I couldn't contain my excitement – we had done it.

Bournemouth Half Marathon


Michelle Lewis completed the Bournemouth Half Marathon raising an incredible £810!

Last year, James Mainwaring decided he would participate in the Ironman 70.3 Weymouth following the devastating loss of his baby boy, Archie, to show his appreciation for the care and support him and his wife received and fundraise for SPRING who supported him and his wife during this heart-breaking time.



James says "Before July, I was like most people and had no idea what SPRING did let alone who they were. This all changed on 4 July 2020 when my wife and I lost our beautiful baby boy Archie William Mainwaring.

On the evening of the 3 July, my wife and I received the soul crushing news that they could not find a heartbeat after rushing to the hospital with cramps. In the early hours of the morning of the 4 July, Archie was born at 39 weeks and 2 days. At this moment, everything was in pieces, all my plans and dreams with my son had been ripped from me.

It was at this point where SPRING stepped in and began to support my wife and I. They helped and taught us to pick ourselves up and begin this new difficult chapter in our lives. They were there supporting

us until we could support ourselves.





Since July 2020, my life has taken a different route and my outlook on life is different. My son is always at the forefront of everything I do. I have set myself a personal goal of completing the Weymouth IRONMAN 70.3 and want to use this opportunity to support a charity that supported me in my time of need."

This challenge involved swimming 1.2 miles, followed by a 56 mile bike course ending with a 13.1 mile run!! James completed it in 6:05:52 which he was over the moon with!!

We know how hard you've worked at training for this event, James, and would like to thank you so much for raising over £1,700 for SPRING!!



Cycle for SPRING

Last September, nine cyclists along with their support drivers, took on the epic challenge of cycling 431 miles from Poole to Bath and back, via Wembley and Torquay to raise funds for SPRING!

The catalyst for this event was the mutual experience of friends, Chris Travers and Micky Hubbard, who tragically lost their baby girls; Olivia-Mae and Cecelia. Following this very difficult time, the common desire to give something back to SPRING who supported both families through this devastating time came about when Micky purchased a bike and discovered the holistic benefits of cycling.

With the aim to remember their girls, promote awareness of the support SPRING provides, and raise funds for this service, Chris and Micky, along with seven of their friends planned a cycle challenge and on Thursday 30 September began their "Cycle for SPRING" route from St Mary's Maternity Unit in Poole.

Despite the weather not being the kindest and faced with some tricky terrain, punctures, and snapped chains along the way, the wonderful Cycle for SPRING team completed this immense challenge arriving back to St Mary's Maternity Unit on a cold and wet Sunday afternoon!
